Trilog (EC/MS/EP)

- Agreed on Specific Programme (April 2019)
- Agreement on budget (Autumn 2019)
- Finalisation of Horizon Europe: mid 2020/ Start 1.1.2021

Next

- 1. Strategic plan 2021 2024 (Adoption: mid 2020)
 - »Public online consultation called "orientation"
 - »Discussions with umbrella organisations and MS Shadow Committee
- Implementation strategy (Adoption: end 2019)
 - » Organisation of calls, evaluation of proposals, grant agreements and project management
 - »Public online consultation called "co-design exercise"

Implementation of Horizon Europe (Proposal EC)

Work Programme design

NEW:

- Multiannual Call topics
- TRL prescription
- New definition of "Impact"
- Applicants can decide on type of Action (RIA/IA/CSA)
- Submission and Evaluation

NEW:

- Blind evaluation in first stage
- Management structure not needed/evaluated any more
- Reduced aspects for first stage evaluation
- Allow substantial changes between stages
- Transparent criteria for prioritising tied scores (increase range above threshold)
- Pilot scheme to allow reaction on preliminary evaluation comments
- Model Grant

NEW:

- Only 3 different Model Grant Agreements (now 40)
- Simplified personnel cost calculation
- Increase "lump sum" projects
- · Clarification regarding "Third party" "In-kind contribution", "International organisations"



Implementation of Horizon Europe



Dissemination and Exploitation

NFW:

- Increased focus
- Encouragement for Third Party exploitation
- Horizon Results Platform
- Financial incentives for reporting after end of project duration
- Strengthening feedback to policy
- Data and Reporting

NEW:

- Horizon Dashboard will include information on all individual researchers involved in Projects
- · Creation of a central data hub through linking with external data (e.g. MS data) sources
- Partnerships (e.g. EraNets, JPI, JU)

NEW:

- Restricted Nr. of partnerships (proposed: 44 +3)
- Budget proposal: 25% of Pillar 2: ~13 Billion €
- Impact assessment of ongoing partnerships
- Launch of new partnerships early 2021

Types of partnerships



- Institutionalised partnerships
 - Art. 185 (PRIMA) or Art.187 (BBI)
 - EIT KIC (e.g. Raw Materials)
- Co-programmed partnerships (JPI type?)
 - MoU/Contracts between EC and public/private partners
 - Establishment of a common strategy/agenda
 - Budget contribution from all partners (financial/in-kind)
- Co-funded partnerships (EraNet cofund type?)
 - Combined funding EC- Partners (financial/in-kind)

Partnerships relevant for Forestry



Cluster 5:

• Built environment and construction (Co-Programmed) (former Energy efficient buildings)

Cluster 6:

- Towards more sustainable farming: agro-ecology living labs and research infrastructures (Co-Funded) (*former JPI FACCE*)
- Rescuing biodiversity to safeguard life on Earth (Co-Funded) (former Era Net Biodiversa)
- European Partnership for a Circular bio-based Europe: sustainable innovation for new local value from waste and biomass (Art187/Co-Programmed) (*former JU BBI*)
- Forestry (Co-Funded) ??? (decision 12/9 Shadow Committee meeting)



Horizon Europe – "Missions"

- High ambition/profile to have a strong impact ("Man on the Moon")
- Small number of "visible" missions, shared design between EC, MS and stakeholders
- Inclusion of society, cross-sectoral and multidisciplinary orientation
- Implementation rules for Missions will be ready by end 2019, strategic plans ready by early 2020
- Proposed budget: 10% of Pillar 2 (~140 M€/Mission/year)

Mission Areas:

- Adaptation to Climate Change, including Societal Transformation
- 2. Cancer
- Healthy Oceans, Seas, Coastal and Inland Waters
- Climate-Neutral and Smart Cities

Soil Health and Food MB Chair: Cees Veerman, former Dutch Agriculture Minister Forestry expert: Emil Cienciala; Institute of Forest Ecosystem IFER Ltd. and Global Change Research Institute (GCRI), CAS (EFI member)

Mission boards (2200 proposed members) 15 Experts/board: Task is to propose 1 to 2 concrete themes/Mission as a starter



COST Update



- Old Structure: Forest, Products and Services Domain
 - 36 COST Actions dedicated to Forestry (excl. Wood/Fiber)
 2006 to 2014
 - 4 Actions/year
- New COST Structure since 2015
 - New evaluation and selection procedure favouring interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary Actions
 - Forest related COST Actions since 2015: 4
 - < 1 Action/year</p>
 - But if searched for Biodiversity: 11 Actions found

Conclusion



- Structure of Horizon Europe not much different to H 2020
- Instead of SC there will be Clusters
 - Environment not a separate Cluster
- Not a specific Forest Programme but good chances in Cluster 5 and 6
- Devil is in the details:
 - Partnership reorganization is threaten the success for the Forest Community
 - Needs EFI members help to establish a Forest related Partnership
- COST Actions led to several H2020 project application
 - Need to continue networking:
 - EFI Network Fund, SNS network, IUFRO,...
 - New COST applications: think out of the box!!
